

## **Hexham Farmers Market**

## Risk Assessment relating to re-opening the market after Covid19 closure

## **Background**

Although a small number of farmers markets have continued to operate throughout the Covid19 lockdown, the Hexham Farmers' Market (HFM) Directors And Manager took the decision in mid-March 2020 to close the market until lockdown measures were modified and the risk was deemed to have reduced significantly.

On 25<sup>th</sup> May the government further announced that all outdoor markets could resume trading from 1<sup>st</sup> June 2020 with the right safety measures in place. The HFM Market Manager and Directors have created this risk assessment to show the issues we have considered and the measures we have taken to allow us to trade as safely as possible at the current time.

Our first market was held on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> June, trading from 9 to 1.30, and with 9 trading stalls, reduced from our usual 20-24 stalls. On the 27 of June we will have 15 stalls, 5 of which will be on the Abbey Flags (with permission from the Abbey Church Wardens). The stalls on the flags will be space like the ones on the Market Place and the same circulation system employed.

HFM have informed the following with our plans to re-open:

Hexham Town Council, Northumberland County Council, Hexham Courant.
